WITH GOD ALL THINGS ARE POSSIBLE

What a loving, gracious, merciful, and generous God we have. He has blessed Crowley's Ridge College immensely in a number of areas. I am very happy to summarize some of these blessings in my article for this spring edition of The Insider.

Five new degree opportunities are being offered at CRC through our **Division of Arts & Sciences** that will **begin the Fall 2023 semester**. These new degrees are made possible **through CRC's new joint programs and articulation agreements** with **Harding University** and **Freed Hardeman University** available for CRC students. Below is a summary of these new degree opportunities and links to find out more about them, including required GPA, coursework, and other information:

- Complete a Bachelor's of Arts in General Studies at CRC in 3 years, then transfer to Harding University to complete a Doctorate of Pharmacy degree in 3.5 more years.

- Complete an Associate of Science at CRC in 2 years, then transfer to Freed Hardeman University to complete a Bachelor of Science in Nursing in 2 more years.

- Complete an Associate of Arts in General Studies at CRC in 2 years, then transfer to Freed Hardeman University to complete a Bachelor of Arts in Speech Language Pathology Assistant in 2 more years.

- Complete an Associate of Science in General Studies at CRC in 2 years, then transfer to Freed Hardeman University to complete a Bachelor of Science in Chemistry in 2 more years.

- Complete an Associate of Science in General Studies at CRC in 2 years, then transfer to Freed Hardeman University to complete a Bachelor of Science in Biology in 2 more years.

These new degree opportunities mean that Crowley's Ridge College must build a new Chemistry facility, which should look very much like these next architectural

renderings. As you drive onto the beautiful 150-acre campus, a new state of the art, modern looking brick and rock Chemistry building with glass in key focal areas, a chemistry lab, research lab, classrooms, and offices will be on your left and easily seen from the main highway. Plans are to begin construction on our new Chemistry facility beginning this summer. The cost is estimated close to \$1.25 million and will require approximately one year to complete. As you see below, plans are well underway to begin construction July 1, 2023:

- 1/3/23 - Surveyor completed survey to determine facility location, slope, drainage and parking challenges.
- 2/15/23 - Met with architect, contractor, and surveyor to finalize the exact location of this building, construction materials, and other specifics, including parking lot locations.
- 7/1/23 - Date agreed to begin construction
- 7/1/24 - Date agreed the new Chemistry Facility will be ready to move into as CRC prepares to host classes beginning Fall 2024.



Sounds great, doesn't it? Nearly \$1.1 million has already been raised in our Mission Possible Campaign, the largest fundraising campaign in CRC's history! Yes, however, the pledges are coming in over five years and our current cash gifts are only at \$251,805. That means CRC needs to raise \$1 million in cash gifts by the end of 2023 with at least \$500,000 received by August 1st of this year. That's what led me to title this article, "With God All Things Are Possible." I believe that, and I know that many of you agree with this important statement from Matthew 19:26.

That leads me to my next point. During the planning for this new Chemistry facility, CRC was told about a new opportunity in one of our critical infrastructure areas that will enable all campus buildings to be connected to Paragould city sewer. Correcting this old waste water issue will be a huge improvement for CRC's campus and enable the college to strategically grow as we add other buildings as outlined in our Mission Possible campaign available at www.crc.edu/mission-possible. As you can imagine, the cost is fairly high because of designing this new waste water system, installing a lift station, and installing pipes for more than a mile before they can be connected to Paragould's system. The total cost for this new system was just estimated at approximately \$325,000 and perhaps much more. This needs to be taken care of before the construction of the new Chemistry facility can be completed. I had not planned on correcting this infrastructure issue so soon, but it really must be done. I am asking for your help in raising an additional \$325,000 or more by June 1, 2023 as construction will need to begin as soon as the new system design is available and approved.

Friends, I know that CRC raising this \$1 million for the new Chemistry facility and another \$325,000 to correct CRC's campus waste water issues in such a short time seems very difficult. However, with God all things are possible!

Shortly after I began serving as president in January 2020, many asked what all my team would do to sustain Crowley's Ridge College. One of the key issues was to increase CRC's enrollment, then Covid began in March of 2020. However, CRC still managed to increase our enrollment every year since 2020, while many private and public colleges in Arkansas and across the nation reported decreasing enrollment numbers. How did we do that? Because of a lot of hard work by a very dedicated faculty and staff, combined with improved degree plans, a new full-time campus ministry program, and a renewed focus on our mission as we provided a safe, Christian environment that did not give in to the division and liberal woke nonsense that has been rampant in many parts of this country. With God all things are possible!

I have been out making donor and church visits telling about how God is blessing CRC and asking for donations to help the college make these and many other needed improvements. Some of those visits led to immediate gifts. One donor, after reading about charitable IRA rollover gifts, decided to give more than \$74,000 that he did not need. Another donor gave more than \$100,000 the she had in another bank account but no longer needed. Receiving more major gifts like these will enable CRC to continue growing in our enrollment. One donor sent \$25 for our campaign, which we greatly appreciated. Building this new Chemistry facility will lead to many more new students in these new degree areas. Growing our enrollment in this intentional, strategic fashion will enable CRC to serve more students, who will experience a fantastic Christian educational environment.

I have friends that have told me about churches who have hundreds of thousands of dollars in the bank and no plans of what they need to do with that money. I hope they read this article, as CRC has a strategic plan on how our Christian ministry desires and intends to keep improving. I hope you will consider how to support CRC with these important needs. I hope you will include Crowley's Ridge College in your will and estate plan. CRC has served more than 6,000 students since our founding and their impact on His Church is amazing. Help us make an even greater impact as we achieve the goals of this article. With God all things are possible!

Jeremy Pierce, Bible Division Chair at Crowley's Ridge College, recently served as House Chaplain at the Arkansas House of Representatives. On Monday, January 23, 2023, Pierce traveled from Paragould to Little Rock to lead our state legislators in prayer. The role of Chaplain is a time-honored tradition in Arkansas as it provides spiritual support to our leaders. These leaders are assigned with the difficult task of making significant decisions day in and day out. The House of Representatives convened at 1:30 pm where they were led by Pierce in prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Pioneers had a busy schedule for the Winter months that have now rolled into early Spring. The basketballers of Crowley's Ridge entered the regular season of play with one goal in mind: Get back to the Conference Tournament. The Pioneers and Lady Pioneers both qualified for the CAC Conference Tournament in the 2021-2022 season, but fell short with the Men losing to Washington Adventist in the Quarter-Finals and the Women falling to Haskell University in the Semi-Finals.



Once again, the commander in chief of the Men's Program, Chris Perkins, entered his 16th season. With no senior leadership on the squad, Coach Perkins would look to younger talent in junior Bo Roberson and sophomore Braxton Cousins. The duo would become the spotlight of many games each earning their reputation on the court. Braxton Cousins would particularly shine in week five of the season where Cousins produced a monstrous stat line in the home setback game against Welch College (TN) where he bucketed 35 points, grabbed 7 rebounds, and dished out 4 assists in the loss. The CAC recognized Cousins' efforts and awarded him with the honor of Player of the Week. Bo Roberson made his statement two weeks earlier by grabbing the CAC Player of the Week award in week three with a double-double performance against Dillard University (LA) where Roberson bucketed 16 points and snatched 10 rebounds. Though a junior, Roberson has made his way up the CRC record books, and on February 13th of this year, Roberson came to the center stage as he bucketed his 1,471st career point against Bacone College. With this bucket, the Tuckerman Arkansas Native passed CRC alumnus TeWayne Smith (1,469 2006-2011) for most career points by a Pioneer. The Pioneers are not done yet as they have achieved their goal and qualified for the Conference Tournament once more with an overall record of (10-18) and a conference record of (6-6). The Pioneers are seeded 6th for the CAC Tournament which will take place on February 25th-26th.



Brad Phillips entering his third season as the Women's Head Coach looked to continue to pave the way for the future of the program. Since Phillips joined CRC he has led the Lady Pioneers to two consecutive conference tournaments, 2021 & 2022, and one national tournament appearance in 2021. In the 2022 season, Phillips broke the school record for most wins in a season with 15 before having their year-end with a loss in the CAC Tournament Semi-Finals. This year the Lady Pioneers have outdone what Coach Phillips could have ever imagined. They have had several young players lead their efforts on the court this season with Hunter Gibson plowing the way. Freshman Gibson, the Jonesboro native, currently leads the Pioneers in scoring with 361 points on the year and averages 13.9 points per

game. Gibson was awarded Player of the Week for her CRC record-tying 33-point game in week 5 against Welch College (TN) where the Pioneers sailed to a 91-76 win. Also leading the Pioneers' attack is a familiar name, Octavia Lowery. Lowery, who took a year off, made her return this season for the Lady Pioneers.



The senior picked up right where she left off by making her impact in the game. Lowery has entered most games from the bench but lands second in scoring for the Pioneers on the season with 283 points and averages 11.8 points per game. Lowery has stepped up to help lead the Lady Pioneers in the second half of the season and she has the hardware to prove it. She was awarded Player of the Week in week 8 for her 29-point performance in the 56-54 win over Voorhees University (SC) and again in week 10 for her 19-point game against Welch College (TN) and her double-double performance of 17 points and 13 rebounds two days later against Baptist Bible (MO). Several others have made their impact on the season's success, Freshmen Brinley Morgan, Reigiana Ward, Seirrah Floyd, and Alayzah Foster along with upper-class Travia Woodruff and Lindsey Browning. Once again under the helm of Brad Phillips, the Lady Pioneers have qualified for the 2023 conference tournament February 24th-26th, being placed as the 4th seed. The Lady Pioneers have also reached a new CRC best with a record of 18-9 on the year and 5-3 in the conference. With only the tournament ahead, the team is not done leaving its mark on history.

Baseball and Softball have only just begun their seasons but have started in the right fashion. Senior Pitcher Corbett Seib has passed CRC alumnus Wil Teague (175.2 inns. 2015-2018) for the most career innings pitched with 178.2 in his first start of the season. Softball has opened their season up with a record of 3-1 with two late-inning come-from-behind victories. Golf will pick up its swing in March. We all look forward to seeing many more great things happen through the remainder of spring.

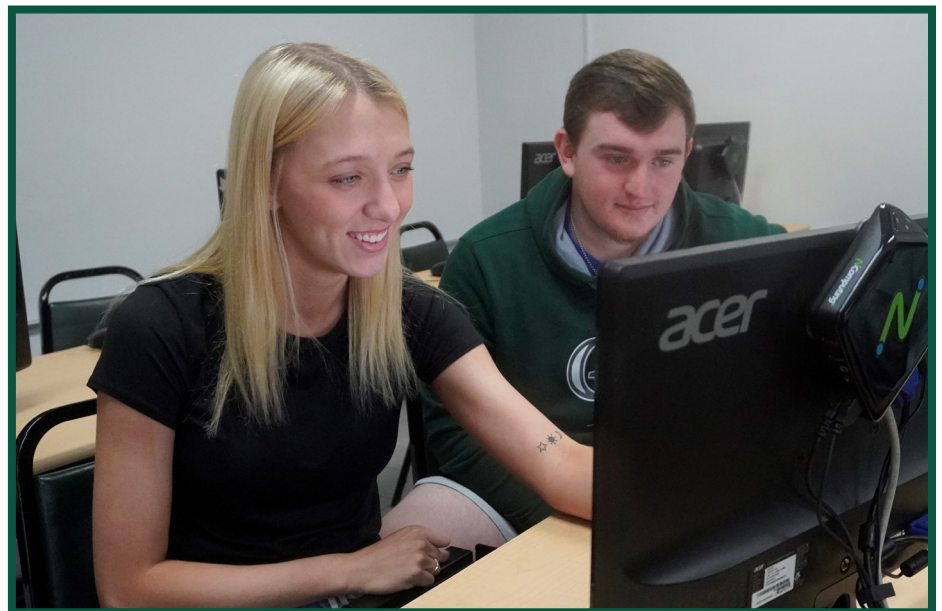
